## G. SUMMARY OF ALLOCATION METHODOLOGY

Funds are allocated to LEAs by scoring application with approved quotes. There are no revisions or carryover allowed after application is approved and funds are allocated.

The following criteria is used to approve and score applications.

- Participation in the National School Lunch Program established under the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act.
- Priority will be given to schools with at least 50 percent of the enrolled students eligible for free or reduced-price meals (F/R%). The F/R% will be used to assess the need portion of the application. The essay narrative will be scored by 3 committee members, added together, divided by 3 and then multiplied by the F/R% to give priority to LEAs with higher need.
- Priority will be given to those who were not previous recipients of the NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants. There are 4 Priority levels: 1 higher than 50% F/R and have never received equipment assistance; 2 higher than 50% F/R and have received equipment assistance; 3 lower than 50% and have never received equipment assistance; 4 lower than 50% and have received equipment assistance.
- Priority will be given to those who have not been granted a PLE waiver for the current school year. LEAs without a PLE waiver will receive 45 points; LEAs with a PLE waiver will receive 0 points.
- Priority will be given to those with a lower Average Daily Participation (ADP). The ADP for SFAs with multiple site applications will be the average of the individual sites' ADP. More points are given for lower ADP: 0-59% receive 15 points; 60-79% receive 10 points; 80-100% receive 5 points.

The State Agency does not set any portion aside for Administrative costs.

\*\*SFAs requesting items between \$1,000 and \$5,000 and the organization or county has a financial policy that allows for capitalization of equipment less than \$5,000, should upload the complete financial policy. Charters should supply the date the board of directors approved the policy. Request for items under \$5,000 will not be approved without submission of a financial policy with the application.

Completion Report (CR) will be available on 7/1/2021 for those SFAs who have completed the Reimbursement Request process to complete the CR without having to wait until after September 30, 2021.

## H. KEY DECISION POINTS AND FLEXIBILITIES

The Average Daily Participation (ADP) percentage is calculated using October claims of the current school year.

The Free and Reduced-price Percentage (F/R%) is from the most recently ADE published list found on the ADE website at http://www.azed.gov/hns/frp/. This report is typically published in January using the October claim data of the current school year.

The quote provided cannot be a screen shot of a webpage showing equipment prices. The quote must include the vendor name and contact information, the LEA name, address and contact. The quote must include subtotals for individual equipment and a total including taxes, shipping and installation if appropriate even if the last is \$0.

LEAs with excess cash are excluded even if Priority 1 unless there is a plan in place to spend the excess cash before utilizing the grant funds.

Must be in compliance with NSLP and Grants Management requirements.

ADE does not set aside any portion of the USDA allocation for administrative costs.
