Overview of Pathways to the Arizona High School Equivalency Diploma

GED Pathway*

Candidate** is required to pass the 4 subtests (Reasoning through Language Arts, Math Reasoning, Science, and Soc. St.) with a minimum score of 145 in each subject area.

College Credit Pathway*

Candidate** must earn 25 college credits in 6 specific subject areas. Classes must be at the 100+ level and with a passing grade letter of 'C' or above.

Career-ready Portfolio Pathway*

The Adult Education student** must accumulate and document 22 points in two areas (Academic Readiness and Career Readiness) through a variety of different sources.

IMPORTANT

*As mandated per A.R.S.§ 15-701.01, any person wishing to obtain an Arizona High School Equivalency Diploma must pass the Arizona Civics Test.

**Per A.R.S.§ 15-702, individuals must be sixteen years of age or older and not enrolled in school, and lack a high school diploma, to be eligible to any of the three HSE pathways in Arizona.

College Credit Pathway Fact Sheet

The College Credit Pathway is an option for adults seeking to obtain their High School Equivalency (HSE) Diploma in Arizona. Effective July 1, 2018, adults can earn their HSE Diploma by demonstrating completion of 25 specific college credits along with passing the AZ Civics Test.

How was the College Credit Pathway approved?

The Arizona State Board of Education approved the College Credit Pathway on December 4, 2017 for implementation on July 1, 2018.

Who is eligible for the College Credit Pathway?

Individuals must be sixteen years of age or older, not enrolled in secondary school or required to be enrolled in secondary school, and lack a high school diploma to be eligible for the College Credit Pathway.

Will the College Credit Pathway replace the GED® Test Pathway in Arizona?

No. The GED® Test Pathway is still available as an option for individuals seeking to obtain their High School Equivalency Diploma in Arizona.

Requirements

- 1. Earn 25 college credits in specific areas.
- Courses must be at the 100-course level or above.
- 3. Passing grade letter of 'C' or above.
- Credits must be earned at or validated by an Arizona public state university or community college.
- 5. Pass the Arizona Civics Test.
