## Entitlement vs. Competitive Funding Applications



## **Description:**

Funding Applications within Grants Management Enterprise (GME) are the vehicle by which Local Education Agencies (LEAs) can apply for federal, state, and other types of funding administered by Arizona Department of Education.

One of the ways to distinguish types of funding applications is by allocation: Entitlement and Competitive Funding Applications.

Entitlement	<ul> <li>Allocation exists in an unapproved application</li> <li>Allocation is available to LEA upon funding application approval by program area director</li> </ul>
Competitive	<ul> <li>\$0.00 allocation in an unapproved application</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>LEA's proposed budget becomes allocation</li> </ul>
	upon program area director's approval

## **Entitlement**

When the funding application's <u>Budget</u> page is opened, you can see an existing allocation. The goal is to budget up to that full allocation. You will not be able to overbudget.

## Competitive
